Chapter 1: Policy Editing and POC Impact

WCPOLS Record Types Used in POC

Policy Data is reported to NCCI in the WCPOLS format. The POC process uses seven different records to create a transaction:

- Header Record—Used for many of the policy level demographic data and the Agent's Name
- Name and Address Records—Linked Names and Addresses create the Employer records for POC
- State Premium and Exposure Records—POC is only created when a state premium record is reported for the state on the policy
 - The Exposure Record must be reported in order for the state premium to not reject
 - POC only uses the exposure to produce the Governing Class Code
- Endorsement Identification Record—The only endorsement reported on the Endorsement Identification Record that is used for POC is the Include/Exclude Corporate Officers endorsement
- Deductible Endorsement Record—The Deductible Endorsement Record is being used by more and more states with an emphasis on getting data for large deductible policies

NCCI Policy Editing and POC Impacts

When the Policy Data is reported, NCCI applies edits that are broken down by data grade


- Data Grades 4, 6, and 7—there was an error, but the data was accepted
 - Will be used for POC
- Data Grades 8 and 9—reject data grades
 - Data is not used for POC
 - Data Grade 8 means a single record was rejected
 - Data Grade 9 means the entire transaction was rejected

A policy edit can lead to a POC reject

- Impact for employer:
 - Employer in noncompliance—can lead to a stop work order from the state
 - Employer can be charged compliance fines
- Impact for carrier:
 - May be in timeliness reporting fines, depending on how long it takes the carrier to fix the data

Chapter 2: Reporting Names and Addresses

An employer for POC is a linked Name and Address Record.



Link the Name and Address Records by reporting the same value in the Name Link Identifier and the Name Link Counter Identifier on both records.

- Name Link Identifier:
 - A 3-digit field and the primary insured name and address should always be reported as 001
- Name Link Counter Identifier:
 - Used to accommodate policies with more than 1000 names, usually large PEO policies
 - Should be reported as 00 on any policy where there are less than 1000 names.

Both the Name Link Identifier and the Name Link Counter Identifier need to match on both records to link them and to create an employer.

- Continuation Sequence Number:
 - Only reported on the Name Record
 - Used to link multiple Name Records together when an employer has multiple names with different FEINs
 - Is also used on the rare occasion when the name is more than 90 bytes
 - Employers reported on just one Name Record will always have 001 reported in this field
- State Code Link:
 - Only reported on the Address Record
 - It links the employer to the POC jurisdiction where you want the employer reported
 - Used mostly for the Address Type 6 record that does not have a reported state abbreviation
 - Also important for the Address Type 2 record when reporting an out-of-state address



Best Practices for Name and Address Reporting

- Report one name per record when each part of the name has a different FEIN
- Report the same linking fields for names and addresses throughout the life of the policy

Chapter 3: Advanced Name and Address Reporting

What name should you report?

- WCIO = Report the name of the insured that corresponds to the Type of Name Code reported in position 48
- IAIABC = Silent
- NCCI = Only one name is to be reported per Name Record

For proof of coverage, it really comes down to one thing: What does the jurisdiction need?

Jurisdictions just want to be able to find the employer for:

- Claims processing
- Compliance

Employees may not know the correct name of their employer in the event of an injury. Are you reporting all the employer names for all the employees covered on a policy? Are those employers being reported consistently from one policy year to another?

When the names and addresses are improperly linked or inconsistently reported, it can lead to unreported coverage or improperly reported coverage which may lead to fines.

Name and FEIN are only reported to state when an address is linked to the name and to the state.

When NCCI processes a New or Renewal transaction, we don't look at the Policy Change Effective or Expiration Dates, so even if you try to populate these fields on the transaction, they will be ignored and not used.

The most important thing to take from this processing rule is, if you are trying to report an employer with a midterm effective date, you cannot report that employer on the establishing transaction. It must be reported as an add on a subsequent full policy replacement.

Unreported Coverage

Here is one name and one address operating in Georgia. Even though we will not display it here, let's keep in mind that proof of coverage requires a state premium record to be reported for each state that you want proof of coverage reported to. So, in this case, we would also be reporting a Georgia state premium and exposure record.

We always start with NLI 001 and CSN 001. The only required address is the mailing address and since that is the only address for the policy, it must be reported as Address Type 1.

But what if JOSIE INC is doing business as JOSIES HAT SHOP in Georgia? If the Doing Business As (DBA) is not reported on the policy, that coverage is missing. If an employee gets hurt working in the store, do you think they will say they were working at Josie Inc or Josies Hat Shop? That is why the DBA is so



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important to report, as not reporting it could lead to a claim not being handled in a timely fashion. Let's add the DBA.

With only one address, we can report the DBA with the same NLI and NLCI with a different CSN.

Since we reported the same linking fields on the Name and Address Record, the employer will be reported for Georgia. But what if the employer also crosses the border into Florida every once in a while, and works there? Maybe they have some travelling salespeople? Well, we would also report a Florida state premium record and exposure record, but if we do not link an Address Record to the state of Florida, coverage will be incorrectly reported. We must always report at least one Address Record for each state where you want coverage to be reported.

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For Florida, if there is no address in the jurisdiction, report an Address Type 6. The Address Type 6 must be reported with the correct state code link to generate the employer record. If you do not link at least one address for each name that operates in that state, you have unreported coverage.

The state code link does not apply to the mailing address. The mailing address will only generate an employer record for the state reported in the state abbreviation if that state has reported state premium. This makes it critical to report that out of state address or Address Type 6 when the mailing address has an out-of-state address.

Improperly Reported Coverage

Let's say we have an insured, Roguens Inc, with two different DBAs. Roguens Shoes and Roguens Socks. How do we report those names? One way to report them is like this, with the insured name and DBA on the same record.

NCCI recommends reporting one name per record. And no matter which way you report the names, remember to be consistent from one year to the next. We will stick with the one name per record rule here, because that is NCCI's best practice.

NCCI's DATA NOW PROGRAM

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If you change how the names are reported on the renewal from what was previously reported, you create coverage issues for the jurisdictions that require manual intervention.

The POC state may be looking for coverage for three missing employers on the 2026 renewal because the previously reported names no longer exist.

Usually, a DBA has the same FEIN as the insured, so all three of these records would be reported with the same FEIN.

If one of the names had a different FEIN, then the only way to report that FEIN is to report the name on a separate record, so keep that in mind when reporting names and FEINs. But here, we have one FEIN for all the names, so reporting one name per record is not required, although still recommended.



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Where do these employers operate? Where they operate is as important as who they are when determining the correct linking fields to report.

For our example, there are three addresses. The mailing address is a PO BOX, and there are two physical addresses that employees work at.

How do we link the names and addresses? Do all the employees work at all the addresses? If they do, then we can use one name link identifier and link them all together like this.

When we link all the names to all the addresses, we will generate an employer record for each combination. To figure out how many employer records we will report to Florida if we report our Policy Data like this, we multiply the number of names to the number of linked addresses, and in this case, we would report 9 employer records to Florida. Reporting like this will not trigger any Policy Data grade edits. But is it correct reporting?



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Let's think about this for a minute. What if Roguens Shoes was located in Boca Raton and Roguens Socks was located in Miami? It is unlikely that an employee in Miami is also working at a store in Boca Raton, and doubtful that every employee is going to the PO BOX in Orlando to pick up mail.

In this scenario, we would not want to report just one name link identifier and link all the names and addresses together. We need to report a separate name link identifier for each location, and then properly link the names to each address, depending on which employer is operating at which address.

Here we have the same exact number of records being reported on the policy, but since each name is only linked to one address, this policy will only generate 3 employers for the state, not 9.

Reporting like this, Roguens Inc is only going to be reported linked to the PO BOX, and it is very possible that it needs to be linked to the location of operations as well. But if it has its own name link identifier, how would we link them correctly?

ROGUENS INC would need to be reported linked to each address. This would be the correct way to report the names to generate the correct employers for the state.

It is just as important to consider where the employees work as what the FEIN is for the name.

And it is just as important to be consistent on the Renewal as to not create missing coverage issues. For example. If we reported the 2025 policy like this.

We just created a coverage issue for the state because the names do not match what was previously reported. If they are looking for coverage for DBA ROGUENS SOCKS, it would require manual intervention to figure this out. So, when a name is missing from the renewal that was previously reported, it could trigger an investigation for no coverage.

Best Practices for Name and Address Reporting

- Report one name per record when each part of the name has a different FEIN
- Report the same linking fields for names and addresses throughout the life of the policy
- Report consistently from one policy year to the next

Chapter 4: Proof of Coverage Process

Timing

The POC process runs Monday through Friday at 1:00 a.m. and reports the data submitted to NCCI on the previous day to the states. Monday's file includes all the data reported Friday through Sunday.

IAIABC POC Record Types

POC data is transactional—the POC process must determine what changed from one transaction to the other to report the correct transaction to the state in these two record types:


- Insured Record (PC1)—contains the policy level and transaction level information along with the Primary Insured information:
 - PC1 Elements:
 - Carrier Information
 - Policy Number
 - Policy Effective Date

- Primary Insured
- Insured Demographics
- Agent Information
- Transaction Type
- Transaction Effective Date
- Employer Record (PC2)—contains the employer data for each employer reported for the state:
 - PC2 Elements:
 - Employer Name
 - Employer FEIN
 - Employer Address
 - Industry Code
 - UI Number
 - Number of Employees
 - Legal Nature Code
 - PEO/Client Code

POC Process—Policy to POC

- Begins with the carrier's policy source system
- NCCI Database—the Policy Data is reported to NCCI in the WCPOLS format. This is when the data receives a data grade and NCCI edit reports are available for the carrier.
- The accepted data is viewable in POC Inquiry, which is a tool available to all the POC states that search the NCCI database. The POC rules apply to the Policy Data in POC Inquiry and to the files that are generated and sent to the POC states from the 1:00 a.m. process.

POC Process—Acknowledgment to Reject and Error Report


- Several states provide an acknowledgment file back to NCCI to let us know if they accepted or rejected the data.
- Acknowledgment files are processed Monday through Friday at 3:00 p.m.



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- NCCI converts that raw data into the IAIABC Reject and Error Report and the Accepted Report.
- Reports are available via the PDC tool for the data provider to help correct the data. Any changes are reported in the WCPOLS format, and the process begins all over again.


POC Process—Acknowledgment to Reject and Error Report

1. The tripletate code tells the state what type of transaction it is.



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- a. Only reported on the PC1 record
- b. 00 = original transaction
- c. 10 = new policy transaction
- d. 01 = includes employers with physical locations*
*POC distinguishes employers with physical and no physical locations with different triplicate codes.

2. Transaction Effective Date = Policy Effective Date for new policy transactions
 - a. Only reported on the PC1 record
3. Two PC2 records created
 - a. Sandwich Inc = primary insured (on PC1) and an employer (on PC2) because the mailing address resides in Florida, so that makes it an employer. The POC Process must create the PC2 record because some states only consider reported PC2 records as employers and also because the PC2 has several additional fields that are not reported on the PC1 like the Industry code and the UI number.
 - b. Soup Inc = additional employer

- Edits: When you see one of these two edits, the reported Policy Change Effective Date was not used in the change or add transaction:
 - Edit 0151-28—Policy Change Effective Date—DATE IS PRIOR TO THE NAME EFFECTIVE DATE
 - Edit 0151-29—Policy Change Effective Date—DATE IS PRIOR TO THE ADDRESS EFFECTIVE DATE
- Example:
 - Add coverage for new location opened on 02/01/2026

- Name or Address Effective Date

Set the first time a name or address is reported on a policy

Date cannot be changed, instead, reset by:

- Deleting all instances from the policy
- Adding it back with the correct Policy Change Effective Date

Issue: Super Deli Inc did not exist on 02/01/26. Sandwich Inc did.

Scenario 5: Deleting Coverage

Delete Employer Transaction Rules

Transaction Effective Date = earlier date from

- Name Expiration Date
- Address Expiration Date
- State Expiration Date
 - A Delete Jurisdiction transaction occurs when you delete an employer and state in the same transaction
- Common Deleting scenarios

Formal deletes—delete date reported; carrier sets date

Informal deletes—delete date not reported; NCCI sets date

- POC impacts include:
 - Gaps in coverage
 - Timeliness reporting fines
- Causes include:
 - Not reporting a Name/Address/State Premium record that was previously accepted by a POC state
 - Data Grade 8—Record rejected

Example of an Informal Delete

- Primary insured—Lasagna Inc.
- Additional employer—Spaghetti LLC.
- Spaghetti LLC takes on a partner in business. A name change is required.
- Effective date—07/01/2026.

The triplicate codes for the three transactions all have the 33 as the Trans Type Code in the IAIABC Triplicate Codes, signifying a delete. These transactions may have been informal deletes and could require attention.
