
Countrywide–Federal Insurance Office (FIO) Section 111 of TRIPRA of 2015 Data Request

The United States Department of the Treasury's Federal Insurance Office (FIO) has published guidance in the Federal Register implementing the data collection provisions of Section 111 of the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (TRIPRA) of 2015. The FIO guidance asks carriers to report the terrorism insurance data outlined in Section 111 by April 30, 2016. It is expected to be mandatory in 2017.

By the April 2016 deadline, FIO is seeking terrorism insurance data from carriers for Policy Year 2015. A Web portal (<http://tripsection111data.com>) has been created for carriers to report the requested data. Data reported by carriers will be provided to FIO for analysis and the creation of the congressional report required under TRIPRA.

To supplement the workers compensation portion of the data request on behalf of the industry, NCCI is coordinating with the independent state rating bureaus to provide aggregated state data for all states except California and monopolistic states.

The aggregated state data does not supersede the FIO guidance but rather seeks to supplement the workers compensation portion that is requested from individual carriers.
