

## Data Reporting—NAIC Data Call Related to Terrorism Risk Insurance Coverage

The National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) has issued a data call related to terrorism risk insurance coverage. This data call is separate and distinct from the Federal Insurance Office (FIO) initiative to collect data elements in compliance with Section 111 of the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (TRIPRA) of 2015. The NAIC data call related to terrorism risk insurance coverage (NAIC Data Call) is intended to serve multiple regulatory and oversight objectives with respect to the affordability and availability of insurance coverage for acts of terrorism, as well as monitoring insurers' financial exposure to terrorism risk.

The NAIC has requested that NCCI coordinate this effort to provide aggregate workers compensation data by carrier to comply with the NAIC Data Call. **Carriers do not need to take any action for the NAIC Data Call for workers compensation insurance.**

The New York State Department of Financial Services will receive this data call, due to statutory confidentiality provisions covering this type of data, on behalf of the NAIC. The data call will be implemented in two phases:

- In the first phase, 11 states will be included (California, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Florida, Illinois, Louisiana, Missouri, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Texas). These states will provide workers compensation data to the NAIC by the end of April 2016.

NCCI will coordinate and facilitate the pass through of the data for all participating states except California for the first phase.

- In the second phase, the data for the remaining NCCI and independent state rating bureaus will be provided to the NAIC in September 2016.

NCCI will also facilitate these efforts for NCCI states and independent state rating bureaus for phase two.

In subsequent years, NCCI will provide this aggregated data to the NAIC annually each September.

The NAIC Data Call will include Unit Statistical data that was reported for Policy Years 2013, 2012, and 2011. The data for these years will be aggregated by carrier to represent total payroll, premium, and counts for policies that include an additional charge for terrorism coverage and for policies that do not include an additional terrorism charge as reported under Statistical Code 9740—Catastrophe Provisions for Terrorism.
